Her artworks aim to convey the concept of loving mother nature, all its creatures, and the intimate connection between humans and the earth. Cows tend to hide the calf more among five different the livestock animals (sheep, goat, cow, horse, camel, etc.). As a calf cannot follow its mother far, it's a natural intuition that when she hides her calf and returns with an udder full of milk, the calf will not go anywhere.
